Rules for Parade Group

Uniform will consist of: (These items will be furnished by the members and will remain in their ownership)

Dress for Horse: (These items will be furnished by the club, will belong to the club and will be returned to the Parade Chairman at the end of the parade season)

All horses must be neat and clean. It will be at the discretion of the Parade Group Chairman to ban any horse from a parade if it is not clean enough. His or her decision will be final.

Each member will be responsible for his or her own horse or horses and personal equipment. Do not expect the Club or any individual club member to repair or replace your personal equipment if damaged when handled by them while giving assistance to you. Anyone not wanting others to handle their horse or horses or personal equipment will notify the other parade group members. It will be his or her sole responsibility to be ready to ride at PARADE STARTING TIME. It will also be his or her own responsibility to move his or her own vehicle and trailer to another location if riders will unsaddle or disband at a location other than where they originally saddled up. Nor will any club member be responsible for any veterinarian bill, etc. for your horse or horses if any injury occurs when a club member assists another club member with his or her horse or horses.

Parade line will be as follows:

(Note: American Flag first, or on the right of two flags, or in the center of three flags and always 6" higher than the rest of the flags. The American Flag should always be held in the right hand on the right side of the horse.)

1. A column of two's, with flag bearers at the head, one horse length apart
2. Ponies
3. Horses
4. Driving ponies and horses (driving ponies may be placed just ahead of saddle horses)
5. Clean up crew (where necessary)
6. Club vehicle and trailer

Any horse or pony may be led by a walker if necessary. A horse and pony may ride side by side if they are stablemates. This is easier for handling. ***SAFETY FIRST*** It will be at the discretion of the Parade Group Chairman and Club Officers in attendance, to remove any hard to manage or uncontrollable horse from the column and place it in the Club Trailer for the remainder of the parade. If this decision is necessary, it is final. THIS IS, AGAIN, FOR SAFETY FIRST. Rider or riders may finish the parade as a walker or ride in the Club Vehicle.

Do your best to leave any parking lot or street used for saddling or unsaddling as clean as you found it. Businesses have allowed us to use their parking lots without charge. In return it is only fair that we clean up horse droppings and trailer bedding which may have fallen on the parking lot or street.
